





Making a pinwheel

First, go outside and find a stick for your pinwheel.

You will also need:

Scissors

Colouring pens or pencils

Sticky tape

Drawing pin

What to do:

- 1. Colour the pinwheel on both sides you could also add some glitter to make it sparkle!
- 2. Cut the pinwheel template along the dotted lines.
- 3. Fold the small circles at the end of the sails to meet the small circle at the centre of the pinwheel.
- 4. Carefully push the drawing pin through all the small circles at the centre.
- 5. Place the stick behind the pinwheel and push the drawing pin into the wood to secure the pinwheel to its handle. Don't push the drawing pin too tightly or the wheel won't spin!
- 6. Check the back of the stick to ensure the sharp end of the drawing pin is not sticking out; if it is, place some sticky tack over.

Now, test your pinwheel outside on a windy day and send me some photos!

Foundation PE (Reception)

Simon Says Warm-Up Activity 25

Simon Says

- · Remind children about the rules of 'Simon Says'.
- · They should only do the action if 'Simon Says' is said before the instruction.
- · They should not do the action if 'Simon Says' is not said.
- Give children a range of aerobic and stretching activities to warm their bodies and muscles up.
- Alternate between 'Simon says...' followed by the action, and just shouting an action.
- Some actions you could use are:

Jog on the spot.

Run around the room, changing directions.

Skip around the room.

Touch your toes, keeping legs straight.

Five tuck jumps on the spot.

 You could ask a child to be Simon and allow them to give out the instructions.

Teddy Bear, Teddy Bear Warm-Up Activity 29

Teddy Bear, Teddy Bear

- · Ask all the children to stand in a circle.
- Explain that one child will stand in the middle and say:
 - "Teddy bear, teddy bear ... (they should then give an action.)"
- · The other children should copy the action.
- They should repeat this 3 times, either with 3 different actions or the same one repeated.
- · Followed by:
 - "Child's name, it's your turn to be teddy bear now!"
- The children will then swap places and the child in the middle will now complete the rhyme.
- · Play the game for about 5 minutes.

We hope you had a great half term and enjoyed the slightly warmer weather. Spring is almost here! Have you spotted any crocuses yet?



Did you know it is possible to identify trees without their leaves? We can look at the

shape, size and colour of their buds and also look for catkins and cones. Deciduous trees all have buds at this time of year, waiting for the spring sunshine to give them energy to grow into leaves and blossom.

This week we would like you to go for a walk in a woodland or area with some trees. Use the winter twig ID sheet attached to identify and name the trees you find. Use your observation skills to look carefully at the buds.

Here are some bud facts to help you. Over time and with practise you can easily learn to identify trees in winter from their buds. Good luck identifying buds!



Ash tree buds are black and chunky.



Beech tree buds are brown, long, thin and pointy.



Oak tree buds are brown and in clusters.



Hazel buds are tiny and the trees have catkins which look a bit like lamb's tails.
