The school day The school day starts at 8.50am and finishes at 3.20pm for all children in Years 1 and 2.



In year 1, we will be exploring the stories of 'The Tiger in the Garden', 'The Tiny Seed' and 'The formula of Great Kapok Tree'. Whilst exploring these texts, we will continue to embed and deepen our understanding and use of capital letters, full stops, exclamation marks, questions marks and adjectives.

Our key texts for literacy in Year 2 are 'Diary of a Cat Killer' and 'The Magic Faraway Tree'. A
Through exploring these texts, we will identify how vocabulary, grammar and punctuation are used to create intended reading experiences and deliver entertaining narratives. The children will then learn how to use these techniques in their own writing.

★ This term's Geography topic is the UK and their Capital Cities in Year ★1 and the World's Continents and Oceans in Year 2. We launched into ★ our topic today with an exciting experience afternoon where the ★ children investigated where in world they live and what makes their ★ place in the world special to them!



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A Year 1 will be investigating 'Plants' and continuing to explore 'Seasonal Changes' in science lessons this term, A learning all about the five senses and how they help us. Year 2 will investigate 'Animals including humans.'

💢 <u>High 5 Readers</u> Studies show that reading for pleasure makes a big difference to children's educational 🛣



performance. We know how important reading is to the educational progress of our children. That is why we insist children read regularly at home, as well as in * school. Children who read 5 times a week at home are awarded the 'High Five' Reader Award.' Therefore, it is important to note all home reading in children's reading records. Records are checked every Monday. It is great to see a variety 🥋 of texts being read by children at home, in addition to their school reading books. Nurturing a child's love of reading is vital to ensure they become fluent readers.
