It is important that children have their reading books and records in school every day.

This term's homework challenges will be shared along with this letter. Please encourage your child/ children to complete all the challenges throughout the term as they will enhance and consolidate their learning in school. The challenges can be completed in any order and brought into school as they are completed to display in the classrooms. Curriculum




The theme of this term's topic is Diversity. In Geography lessons, we will be learning about Natural Disasters, learning about earthquakes, tsunamis and volcanoes. We will explore how these events happen by understanding more about the movement of tectonic plates, the impact these events have on people and environments as well as how communities prepare for and recover from natural disasters. We will be learning about Earth and Space and Forces

in Science lessons. The topic mat provides the knowledge, vocabulary and key texts for this term. Please encourage your children to share this with you at home.

This term, we will be reading the text Running Wild, by Michael Morpurgo. The book is about a family trying to make a new start by moving to live in Indonesia. Michael Morpurgo based his book on real life events following the family's exciting adventures.



<u>PE</u>



Year 5 have PE on Wednesdays and Fridays this term.

Year 6 have PE on Mondays and Thursdays

We ask that children come to school dressed in their PE kit or suitable Forest School clothing.

PE kit is black or navy jogging bottoms, shorts or leggings, a white t-shirt and their Moorside hoodie. They will also need appropriate footwear for outdoor PE. This should not be school shoes.

What to bring...
