### IMPORTANT KNOWLEDGE – 5 FINGER FACTS

<b>Amphibian</b>	Vertebrates which are able to live both in water and on land.	Mammals give birth to live young and birds lay eggs.
<b>Insect</b>	Creatures which have bodies with three segments that are protected by a hard shell.	The environment can affect the life cycle of a living thing.
<b>Mammal</b>	An animal that breathes air and has a backbone.	Insects and amphibians go through a transformation process called metamorphosis.
<b>Classification key</b>	A set of questions about the characteristics of living things.	There are male and female parts of the plant called stamen and carpel.
<b>Life cycle</b>	Changes which an organism goes through during its life.	A natural scientist observes natural behaviour of plants and animals without experimentation.

<b>20<sup>th</sup> Century</b>	The time between 1901 to 2000.	During the 20th Century, working conditions became better for many people; the government limited working hours and workers had the right to paid holidays which meant people had more time to enjoy leisure activities such as holidays.
<b>Entertainment</b>	Something that interests or amuses someone and provides pleasure in daily life.	
<b>Economy</b>	The word economy describes how a country or place is doing in making goods, and how much money it has.	The economy also grew meaning that people had more money to spend on buying and doing the things they enjoyed.
<b>Recreation</b>	Recreation is an activity that is relaxing and fun.	As the twentieth century progressed, there was greater emphasis on home-based leisure and recreation.
<b>Leisure</b>	Freedom from work or other duties that take time and effort; free time.	The invention of radio, television, video-players, hi-fi sound systems and personal computers meant that people could experience entertainment in the comfort of their own homes at little or no extra expense.
<b>Decade</b>	A period of 10 years.	During the 20th century, there were many technological inventions that changed the way people recorded and listened to music.

<b>Gospel</b>	The gospel is the good news of God loving and saving his people through his Son, Jesus Christ.	Christianity is a religion which began after Jesus died. His disciples and apostles had no money to build churches at first.
<b>Revelation</b>	When something is made clear or obvious that was hidden before.	Heavily populated areas have megachurches, where thousands of people can worship together.
<b>Denomination</b>	A particular religious group which has slightly different beliefs from other groups within the same faith.	Beautiful decorations inside a church help people feel like they are in a special, important place and reminds them of Bible stories and teachings.
<b>Holiness</b>	To be pure and devoted to the church or God.	In very poor areas or hot climates, churches may congregate outside rather than in a building.
<b>Father</b>	Jesus Christ was the one and only Son of God. God is known as 'our Father'	Different denominations of Christianity have different traditions, ceremonies and clothing.
